

### United Hebrew Cemetery "Remember Their Names" Project

"Jewish law requires that a tombstone be prepared, so that the deceased will not be forgotten and the grave will not be desecrated ... The idea underlying this custom is that the dead will not be forgotten when he is being mourned every day..." -- Jewish Virtual Library

#### Background

In the fall of 2021 while updating the database for the United Hebrew Cemetery, with more than 7,000 burials dating back to the 1800s, the Cemetery Committee determined that there are **graves that are lacking an appropriate marker identifying the name of the buried individual**, especially in the *Memorial Garden* (600 grave section opened in 1964) which consist of the flat markers in the south central area of the cemetery.

Rosenbloom Monument Company was consulted to provide a cost estimate to create approximately 40 markers with an estimated cost of \$10,000.



The Cemetery Committee researched Jewish community grants that may be available to help fund this project and applied for an "Anything Grant"—offered each year to St. Louis Jewish community partners which would have covered 50% of the cost. Unfortunately other community priorities took precedent and we did not receive the grant.

Next, the committee researched historical cemetery records, walked and photographed the area, and corroborated as much verifiable data as possible on the names, birth dates, and death dates of the individuals buried, via primary sources, such as obituaries and death certificates.

In the process of verifying these deaths and burials, we learned that some of these individuals had died with no known descendants, some were identified as "charity" cases and buried in donated graves, and others were residents of the Missouri State Hospital on Arsenal Street, at that time operated by the Missouri Department of Mental Health. A total of 37 verifiable unmarked graves were confirmed for the *Memorial Garden*.

#### Phase 1 – Fundraising & Timetable for Project Completion

- The goal is to raise \$10,000 in the first quarter of 2023 to fund the grave markers and to partially offset the cost of installation.
- All markers to be installed in time to hold a group <u>Monument Dedication Service</u> to honor the memories of these 37 individuals at the United Hebrew Cemetery for <u>Shavuot 5783</u> (late May 2023).
- <u>Gifts of any amount</u> are welcome and appreciated. You may wish to consider making your gift in increments of \$250, depending on the number of people you wish to remember.
- United Hebrew Cemetery is a community cemetery. Participation is open to the entire Jewish community.

Additional phases of the project are in the planning stages and will be updated as more information becomes available.

### United Hebrew Congregants are Better Together

United Hebrew has partnered with Better Together, an organization that connects and funds activities pairing Jewish teens with Jewish senior citizens. . For the 2022-2023 School year, United Hebrew has connected its seventh grade Sunday School class, taught by Alex Beer with United Hebrew senior citizens from Brookdale Independent Living.

United Hebrew began its involvement with Better Together during the COVID-19 pandemic. Due to quarantine, students met with their seniors virtually. Although this might sound difficult, Better Together continued to provide United Hebrew with the necessary tools and resources to keep this program strong. Many of the virtual interactions were just short and sweet conversations, asking about each others day, talking about a shared interest or planning their next interaction.

For a young teen, starting a conversation with someone older can cause some stress or anxiety, so the students wrote letters, introducing themselves to prepare for the in person interaction.

"Before the students wrote letters introducing themselves to the residents, we read an article about a study that describes the mutual benefits to both seniors and teens by having them spend time together," Beer said.

Once students and seniors began connecting in person, the idea of L'dor V'dor: passing of tradition was able to shine through this partnership. With the guidance provided by Better Together, students are actively leading and participating in programming, fostering relationships and building a stronger Jewish community.

"While this is only my first year teaching Sunday School and running the program, I envision that it could provide a good educational experience to 7th graders in the future. I am fortunate to be a part of this experience," Beer said.

### Towerman Family Scholarship Fund

#### From Stanford B. Towerman:

I have been a member of United Hebrew for over 65 years. UH has been a home for my family, from my children to my grandchildren and now to my great grandchildren who attend our Saul Spielberg Early Childhood Center. Having served as a president of this congregation and been involved in many different aspects, it is truly home and holds a special place in my heart.

We are at a time in our world where many young people especially, are not joining synagogues in the way people once did just a generation ago. Recognizing that congregational membership as well as educating our children Jewishly can be expensive, I have established the Towerman Family Scholarship Fund with the hope of helping young families join our congregation, fall in love with it, and stay for generations.
