Torah of the Days of Awe: Stories that Shape Us with Rabbi Rosenberg

The High Holy Days are framed by powerful Torah readings—narratives that ask us to wrestle with beginnings, tests of faith, ritual, community, and the meaning of holiness. In this two-part Elul series, we'll dive into the iconic Torah texts of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Why these stories? What do they reveal about how we return, renew, and repair?

Session 1: In the Beginning, A Test

Saturday, August 30

Creation and the Binding of Isaac—Rosh Hashanah's Torah stories and the tensions they hold. What does it mean to begin again? What does faith require of us?

Session 2: A Tale of Three Readings

Saturday, September 13

Leviticus 16, Nitzavim, and Leviticus 19—how the Yom Kippur Torah readings move us from sacrifice to covenant to ethical holiness, and why the Reform movement changed what we read.

It's Good to Be a Prophet: Learning from the Wisdom of the Haftarah for the Holy Days with Rabbi Reinhart

Join Rabbi Reinhart for these in-depth explorations of the Haftarah portions for the Holy Days.

Session 1: Rosh Hashanah: Hannah's Prayer was Answered, Might Ours be Too?

Saturday, September 6

We'll learn the story of Hannah, examine her prayer, and consider some of the allegorical and metaphorical lessons we might learn from her example as we contemplate the themes of the High Holy Days.

Session 2: Yom Kippur: ...But is It? The story of Jonah and more

Saturday, September 20

We'll focus on the fascinating tale of Jonah and the Whale, reimagining the "Big Fish" and deliberating over the role of fate and divine force, while asking the question, "Is it good to be a prophet?"

This month, we shine our Volunteer Spotlight on Myra Ozersky, a devoted member of the United Hebrew family. Myra's dedication to our congregation is unwavering, and she graciously wears many hats in service to our community.



Affectionately known as the "Mahj Lady," Myra ensures that members of United Hebrew and others in the wider community receive their annual Mahjong cards each April. This labor of love involves more than just collecting orders—Myra also has chosen to donate the proceeds from each card order to United Hebrew's Backpack Buddies Program, which provides bulk snacks to schools for students with food insecurities and various family holiday needs.

Each year from October through January, Myra tirelessly manages the entire ordering process. She maintains and updates detailed spreadsheets, carefully tracking names, addresses, card sizes, and quantities ordered. She also spends time collaborating with the UH staff on orders, in addition to making reminder calls, and answering questions to ensure every order is fulfilled accurately and on time. Myra has faithfully taken on this role for the past ten years, and her dedication is shown in every detail.

Myra's volunteerism doesn't stop there. She also lends her helping hands in the United Hebrew Kitchen, assisting with the preparation, setup, and cleanup for Shabbat Noshes. Myra has volunteered in Unique Treasures, our gift shop. More recently, she joined the "Stitch and a Prayer" group, where she continues to find new ways to give back and bring comfort to others.
