SPOTLIGHT: DIPALI HOUSE

Dipali House: Building Community, One Connection at a Time

When Dipali House’s children, Andrew and Abby, became teenagers with lives of their own, she noticed something unexpected: the close-knit parent friendships she’d built over years of school pickups and activity carpools had quietly faded. Busy as she was — as a wife, mother, and financial services professional — she wanted something more: real friendships, built around shared purpose.

That instinct became something meaningful for a lot of women at United Hebrew.

Over the past two years, Dipali, along with friends Patti Hunt and Diane Bleyer, has developed a program bringing women together through conversation, learning, and hands-on volunteering. With encouragement from Rabbi Rosenberg and support from Craig Bleyer of the UH Men’s Club, the group has hosted bimonthly gatherings including a Bunco night, an evening with a therapist, a conversation with our shin-shin Ofir, and a volunteer shift at the Parkway School District food pantry.

The group is designed with women roughly ages 45–65 in mind, though Dipali is clear that no one is turned away. Women outside that range are warmly welcome, and UH Prime Timers remains a wonderful option for single members seeking community.

Dipali traces this vision back to when she and her husband Sandy first joined United Hebrew as newlyweds — and felt the particular vulnerability of being new. She wanted to make sure others didn’t have to wait as long to find their people.

She’s also proud to bring her own story to the table. Growing up as the daughter of Indian parents who practice Hinduism, she offers a perspective that reflects and enriches the diversity of our congregation.



On top of all of this, Dipali volunteers in the Religious School office on Sunday mornings: meeting parents, answering phones, and, characteristically, widening her circle.

United Hebrew is lucky to have her energy pointed in our direction — helping to build the kind of community where friendship and mitzvot go hand in hand.

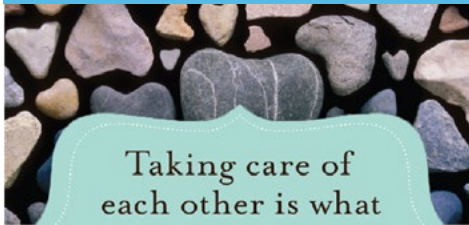

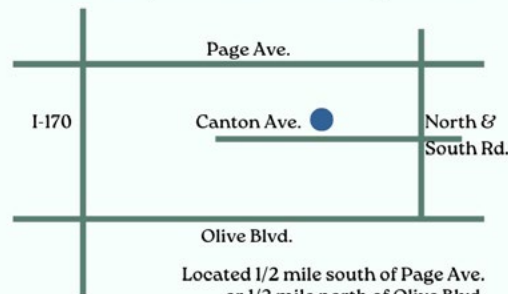
