Honoring Shelli Greenblatt: A Dedicated Volunteer and Community Builder

This month, we proudly honor Shelli Greenblatt for her extraordinary dedication and the many ways she contributes her time, energy, and talents to the United Hebrew community. Shelli exemplifies the spirit of volunteerism, always stepping forward wherever help is needed and consistently working to strengthen and enrich our synagogue family.

She plays an important role on the United Hebrew Tech Team, rotating between sound and camera responsibilities, and supports services and synagogue events and programs behind the scenes.

During Purim, Shelli's creativity and energy shine bright as she contributes countless hours to the Purim Committee. She helps set up and repair carnival games, and her central role is creating and producing the Purim Spiel Set. As stage director, she oversees set design and props; this year, she stepped up to design the costumes with the help of a few other dedicated parents, helping bring the entire production to life.

Shelli also serves on the Education and Engagement Committee, helping create meaningful and fun experiences

for members of all ages. She regularly volunteers for United Hebrew Kids Night Out programs and assists with planning events throughout the year, ensuring that families and children have opportunities to connect and celebrate together.



Her commitment to the UH community also extends to safety and operations. Shelli chairs the Security Committee, helping ensure that United Hebrew remains both safe and welcoming for everyone who enters. You will often find her monitoring the environment for safety during religious school hours.

Shelli's willingness to serve shows up throughout the year and across the calendar. She volunteers during the Passover Seder and assists with the Women's Seder. Whether she is serving food, setting up events, or working behind (or creating!) the scenes, Shelli approaches every task with enthusiasm and care. Even the outdoor spaces at United Hebrew benefit from her dedication: on Sundays, she has helped with landscaping near the religious school entrance, contributing to the welcoming environment that greets families and students each week.

Shelli's connection to United Hebrew runs deep. She is a second-generation member, having grown up at the synagogue and celebrating her confirmation here. Today, that legacy continues: her daughter Erin is a third-generation member, drawn first to UH by its music and welcoming community. On many a Shabbat, you'll find three generations together—Shelli, her mother Phyllis Faintich, and her daughter Erin—a living testament to the bonds this community creates.

These are the people who show up, year after year, for our congregation and the broader St. Louis Jewish community. We are proud to celebrate this year's class.

Diane & Craig Bleyer

Diane and Craig are a four-generation United Hebrew family who have given their time, talent, and heart to this community in every way imaginable, from the Board of Trustees to the Broadway stage. Diane is a published author, tennis team captain, and



champion for writers; Craig founded the UH Men's Group and teaches teen and parent classes on antisemitism. Together, they've raised three children who grew up right here at UH, all of whom graduated from the Saul Spielberg Early Childhood Center, became B'nai Mitzvah, and were confirmed.

Ben Cherry

Ben is a third-generation UH member whose commitment to Jewish life runs deep — from his early days with YPD to his current work on the Jewish Federation of St. Louis board. As



a commercial real estate principal, he even puts his expertise to work helping Jewish organizations navigate their real estate

needs. Ben and his wife Meredith are raising their three young children in Chesterfield — and yes, both Ben and Meredith attended preschool right here at UH! His dedication to ensuring a vibrant Jewish community for the next generation is exactly what the Chai Society is all about.

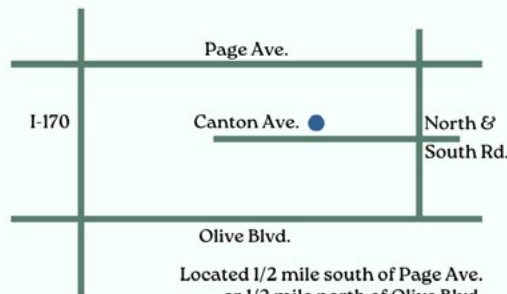
