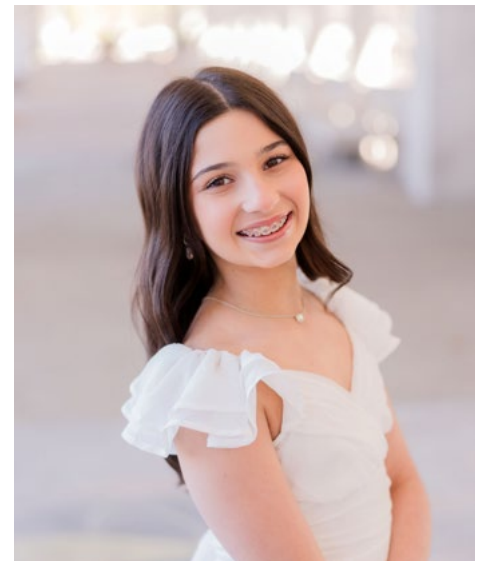

Judy Ormont and Melanie Marks: From Curls to Carnivals

Judy's curls danced and bobbed, and Melanie's daughter twirled with ringlets — and just like that, a "curly girl" friendship was born. What started between two preschool moms bonding over how to manage curly hair has grown into a volunteer partnership more than 21 years in the making. At United Hebrew, we cherish the stories and connections that shape our community — and this one is a favorite.

Melanie is a proud fourth-generation UH member, following in the footsteps of grandparents who were active members and dedicated volunteers. She is honored to continue her family's strong tradition of service. Judy may be a transplant to UH, but volunteering has long been part of her family life as well — her husband Rob set the example through his own commitment to the congregation.

The two are currently recovering from co-chairing the 2026 Chai Society Gala, having brought enthusiasm, creativity, and no small amount of professional skill to this year's university theme. Judy's background as an occupational therapist gives her a

thoughtful, people-centered approach to everything she does, while Melanie's work as a teacher has a way of putting everyone at ease.

Melanie fondly recalls volunteering at United Hebrew Galas as a young teenager, back when her grandparents chaired the event. She especially loved delivering raffle



prizes and getting dressed up to see the congregation gather in celebration. That tradition of showing up has never stopped. You can often find Judy and Melanie at Hamantaschen and challah bakes, floral arranging programs, Mahj Mondays, the Purim Carnival, and Preschool and Religious School events throughout the year — a testament to how naturally service fits into their friendship.

Their connection to United Hebrew runs deep on both sides. Melanie's journey spans religious school, her Bat Mitzvah, baby namings, her current role at the United Hebrew Preschool, and service on the Board. Judy's family has traveled a similar path — from the Saul Spielberg Preschool through Religious School and her children's B'nai Mitzvah celebrations.

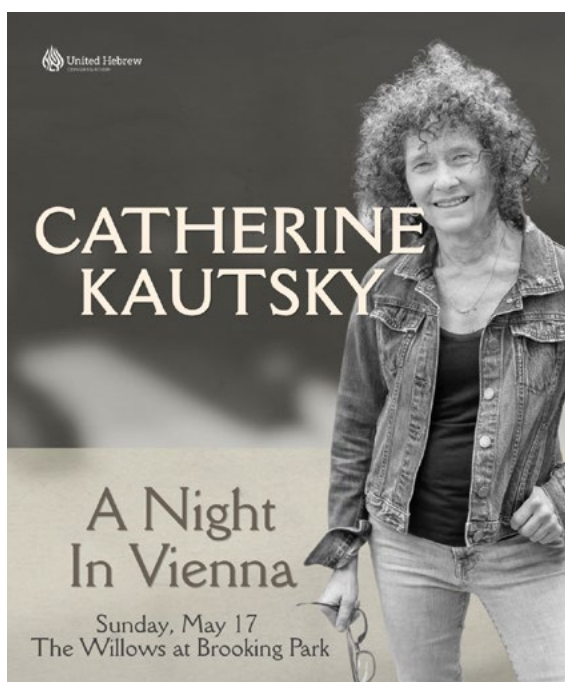

Catherine Kautsky: A Night in Vienna

Join us for A Night in Vienna, a piano concert by acclaimed St. Louis native Catherine Kautsky. This evocative program explores the two faces of Vienna — the glittering cultural capital of Mozart, Schubert, and Beethoven, and the city that exiled or silenced so many of its Jewish composers during the Holocaust. Through music and memory, Kautsky illuminates what Vienna gave the world, and what the world lost.

Praised by The New York Times as a pianist whose music "speaks directly to the listener," Kautsky has performed on six continents and in venues including Carnegie Recital Hall and Alice Tully

Hall. A Professor of Music at Lawrence University, she has received numerous awards for both teaching and the arts, and her recordings of Debussy and Brahms have been acclaimed for their intensity and sensitivity. Her book Debussy's Paris: Piano Portraits of the Belle Époque (2017) was praised for its "gorgeously written, colorful prose," and her 24-part lecture-recital series Great Piano Works Explained (Great Courses, 2022) brings performance and commentary to a wide audience. Most recently, she performed illustrative works at the Relais de la Memoire in Paris.

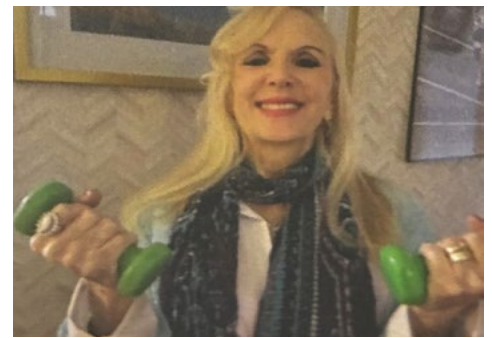

Dynamic/Static stretching

As we all know stretching our bodies daily will help with feeling better during our daily tasks and daily activities.

Dynamic stretching is beneficial to warm up our muscles when we wake up and when we begin a specific exercise routine—side arm circles forward and backward 8 times and simple marches in place.

Static stretching is beneficial after a workout or when any of our muscles feel tight—calf stretch—in a chair extend leg out, heel touching the floor, toes pulled back—hold the stretch 15 seconds or more depending upon how much stretch is needed. Repeat with other leg.

Remember to never bounce into a stretch—keep stretch movement slow and smooth.

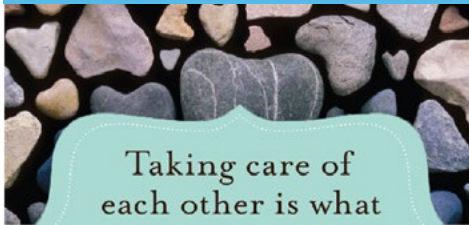

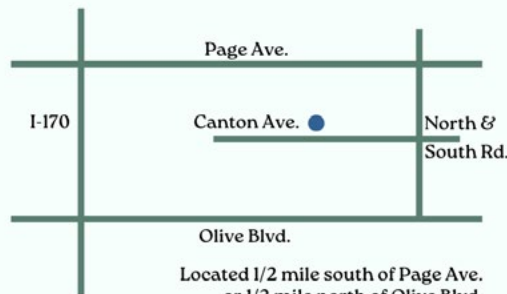
