# Music Notes

## Welcome Home, Greta!

United Hebrew is thrilled to welcome Greta Rosenstock Kramer to our professional staff this July. Many of you already know Greta; she has been a familiar and beloved



presence on our bimah for years, helping to lead services, Tot Shabbat, and Family Shabbat. Her deep roots here are not incidental. They are exactly why this appointment is so meaningful. Greta knows this community, its values, and what music means to us at United Hebrew — and she is ready to help shape what comes next.

Music on the bimah has always been central to our communal life, and Greta approaches that responsibility with both trained musicianship and genuine reverence. She understands prayer as something we enter together — grounded in familiarity, intention, and shared voice. Her guiding philosophy reflects this: 80% familiar and grounding repertoire, no more than 20% new. This is not caution for its own sake. It is a deep respect for minhag hamakom — the musical customs and culture that make United Hebrew home — while leaving thoughtful room for growth. Beyond Shabbat and the High Holy Days, Greta is eager to build a broader culture of music-making throughout the congregation. She

envisioned choral opportunities for adults, teens, and younger children; accessible singing sessions and jam gatherings; concerts; and exploration of instrumental music. Her conviction is simple and compelling: when people sing together outside of worship, they arrive more

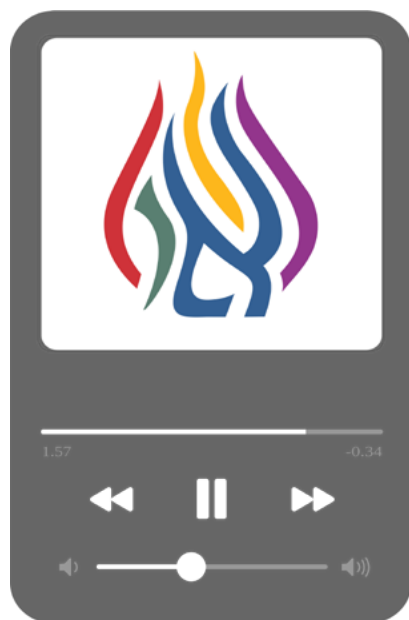
confident, more connected, and more ready to participate fully in prayer.

Greta brings a rich professional background to this role. She has served as Cantorial Soloist for Shabbat and High Holy Days, designed tefillah experiences for students, taught Torah trope, and built choral programs for children and teens. Her work with Lab/Shul in New York City deepened her practice as a ritual leader and storaheller. She previously served as Music and Drama Educator at Saul Mirowitz Jewish Community School and as Music Specialist at UH, and has presented on choral practice and Jewish repertoire at state and international conferences. A St. Louis native

and longtime UH congregant, Greta is completing her Master of Music in Choral Conducting at TU Dublin Conservatoire. We are so glad she is coming home.

Cantor Kalix Jacobson (they/them) is a longtime musician and singer with a background in diverse musical styles. Originally from St. Louis, Missouri (they began as a soloist at United Hebrew!), Cantor Jacobson has been working in Cantorial spaces since 2014 and has been writing music since the early 2000s. This past fall, their Sh'ma Koleinu premiered at Park Avenue Synagogue—they were the

first transgender or nonbinary composer commissioned to write for the congregation. They were ordained from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in 2023, having also received a Masters of Nonprofit Management from the college, having been a Weitzman Fellow for JDC-Entwine, and also having been the recipient of the Rabbi Sarah Messenger Prize, the Josef Frudenthal Memorial Prize for Excellence in Composition, the Palm Beach Liturgical Cultural Foundation Prize, and the Lee Gura Memorial Prize for Aptitude in Synagogue Choral Music. They just finished their tenure at Temple Emanuel of South Hills in Pittsburgh, PA, and are looking forward to beginning their journey as Kol Bo at Temple David of Monroeville, PA on July 1st.

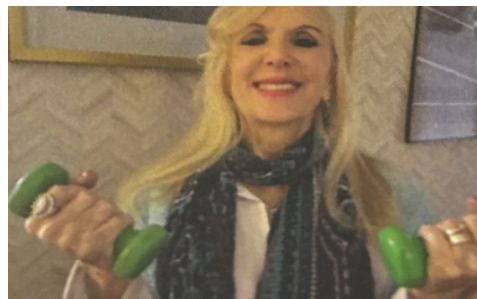

# Rabbi Rosenberg: 25 Years

Rabbi Rosenberg received her honorary doctorate last month at Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati. The DD is awarded to rabbis after 25 years in the rabbinate. You can find the program from Rabbi Rosenberg's ceremony [here](#).

## This morning, I am in Cincinnati marking 25 years in the rabbinate.

Today, I am gathering with classmates, professors, friends, and family and receiving an honorary doctorate from Hebrew Union College–Jewish Institute of Religion.

As I have been thinking about this moment, I keep returning to a memory from my student days at HUC. I used to sit in the balcony of Scheuer Chapel during Founders' Day ceremonies and watch rabbis come forward to receive their honorary Doctor of Divinity degrees. I very clearly remember thinking that those rabbis celebrating 25 years were really old. At the time, 25 years felt impossibly far away. And now somehow, here I am, wondering both how it happened so quickly and where exactly those years have gone.

There is an old rabbinic joke that the DD degree stands for "Doctor of Duration," or perhaps more honestly, "Didn't Die," because 25 years in the rabbinate is no small thing. To spend years walking beside people through joy and heartbreak, births and funerals, celebration and crisis, is both a privilege and a profound responsibility.



Of those 25 years, 22 have been spent here at United Hebrew. There is something profoundly humbling about serving as only the fifth senior rabbi in its history, standing in a chain of leadership built long before me. And yet, I would not be standing here without the

synagogue that raised me, Congregation Emanu El in Houston. They understood that Jewish identity is built through relationships, experiences, and belonging. Those investments shaped my life.

I think about that often here at United Hebrew. Jewish identity is not formed once and then completed. It is built and deepened over a lifetime. The greatest gift we give the next generation is not only programs or classes, but the example of adults who continue to learn, grow, wrestle with Judaism, and show up for one another.

Whatever I mark this morning is inseparable from what we have built together over these past 22 years. No rabbi serves alone.

One of the ways we ensure that the old continue to dream dreams and the youth continue to see visions is through the Messing Family Rabbinic Chair Fund, established to help ensure that United Hebrew will always have rabbinic leadership to teach Torah, guide

our community, and walk beside us through every season of Jewish life. The dream is continuity: ensuring that future generations will have rabbis and cantors who become teachers, counselors, mentors, and trusted companions.

**“No rabbi serves alone. A rabbinate is shaped by trust, relationships, and decades of shared life. Much of what I celebrate belongs to this congregation and to the sacred work we have done together.” Rabbi Rosenberg**

If this moment speaks to you, I can think of no more meaningful way to honor it than through a gift to the Messing Family Rabbinic Chair Fund — an investment not only in a rabbi, but in Torah, Jewish learning, sacred community, and in the generations who will one day walk through these doors.

This is the work of generations. The work of dreamers and visionaries. And perhaps this is the deeper meaning of jubilee — not simply returning to where we began, but returning with gratitude, humility, and renewed responsibility, knowing that what we inherit is entrusted to us only for a time, and then becomes our obligation to strengthen it and pass it forward.
